This erbium laser is about midway between a CO₂ laser and the Fraxel laser. It offers many varied benefits including a brightening "Shining Peel," also called the "Hollywood Peel," as well as facial rejuvenation, lip tint rejuvenation and rejuvenation and tightening of vaginal tissue. This superficial level peel penetrates the stratum corneum and the upper portion of the stratum spinosum to improve your complexion with little downtime, just some slight swelling and mild scaling.


Lip Tint Treatment

In its dual fractional mode, this laser offers a special lip tint technique that can restore color to your lips – a short pulse micropeeling treatment. A longer pulse treatment also offers a deeper thermal treatment to improve wrinkles.

It's very common, yet it's not something that people talk about at the water cooler. Multiple childbirths and aging can lead to relaxation of the vaginal muscles and contribute to incontinence. Vaginal laxity can also mean less sexual enjoyment. Other common complaints, especially among postmenopausal women, are dryness, itching, burning and painful sex due to vaginal atrophy. The medical term for painful intercourse is dyspareunia and it also can occur in younger women.

With the advances in medical technology, there has been an increase worldwide in women seeking treatment for vaginal restoration and currently more than 500,000 procedures are performed annually.

The Action II/BellaV is FDA approved for gynecology including treatment of vaginal relaxation syndrome (VRS) and stress urinary incontinence (SUI). Vaginal relaxation syndrome is both a physical and a psychological problem for women and often their partners.

About 50 percent of post-menopausal women will be bothered by vaginal dryness. Another group of women this laser can help restore comfort and quality of life to is breast cancer survivors who experience vaginal dryness following radiation treatment.

Vaginal tightening used to only be able to be accomplished through surgery which requires about a month recovery period. With the BellaV laser treatment, patients only need to abstain from sexual intercourse for 24 hours following the treatment.

Placing a laser scope in a woman's most intimate

area might seem frightening. But the thermal temperature required to rejuvenate the tissue is not the same level of heat that is utilized to zap facial spider veins, for example. This laser treatment is painless. The Action II BellaV is a safe and non-surgical solution to recondition the vaginal tissue. There are two types of laser pulses which can be utilized depending on the desired treatment — controlled ablation with micropulses and longer pulses with a higher thermal effect to produce neocollagenesis — non-ablative collagen remodeling.

The laser treatments take only about 15 minutes and are performed in a series of 3-5 sessions spaced about one to two weeks apart. Once the laser applicator is inserted, the patient is able to relax comfortably as the laser has 360-degree technology capability to reach the entire area. There is little to no risk of bleeding, pain or scarring and other than a 24-hour period, no downtime.



The BellaV can also improve cosmetic appearance such as reduce dark pigmentation of the vulva and tighten sagaing labia skin.

"The Vbeam Perfecta is great for a whole slew of skin care issues," said Laura Moroney, NP-C. "This laser offers the opportunity to treat the lesion or discoloration with or without the result of purpura — the dark eggplant colored bruising that can occur with the regular Vbeam."





"Purpura is not a bad thing," she explained. "It's the body's healing response to the laser treatment and it completely subsides, but it does appear as a purple like bruise on the skin for several days. So, this must be considered when discussing treatment options."

The Vbeam has been a staple of The Laser Center at Contour Dermatology for years. This laser will remain at the Rancho Mirage office and will be used for patients who need a more aggressive treatment with the endpoint of purpura.

The Vbeam Perfecta is a pulsed-dye laser that

features micropulse technology to target the blood vessels in the skin. The laser's concentrated beam converts the light to heat upon contact which destroys the broken capillaries or other condition while leaving the surrounding skin untouched. For comfort and safety, this laser also has a patented cryogen-based Dynamic Cooling Device® to cool and protect the skin. What's different between the Vbeam and the Vbeam Perfecta is the newer laser has eight filters as opposed to the Vbeam's four filters which can be activated to lessen the purple bruising often associated with Vbeam treatment.

The Vbeam Perfecta is FDA cleared for more than 20 indications including:

- Facial telangiectasia including Rosacea
- Nasal telangiectasia
- Wrinkles
- Leg veins

~ The Future of Dermatology ~ Microbiome Testing for More Personalized Treatment

Your body is made up of over 69 trillion cells. That's a huge army of more than 200 different types of cells marching around to keep you functioning. But not all of these cells are human cells. About 39 trillion of them are microbial

cells – microorganisms living in association with the human body. Scientists and doctors have become increasingly aware of the importance of these micro-

bial cells and are devoting more attention to study them.

The Human Microbiome Project (HMP) 2008-13 was established to further understand how the microbiome impacts human health and disease. A new phase, the Integrative Human Micro-

biome Project, is currently collecting data to create databases to determine their synergistic effects.

Even thousands of years ago, the Greek physician Hippocrates recognized the gut's importance to health and stated, "All diseases begin in the gut." Clearly, having a healthy microbiota supports your overall health.

Many people talk about friendly bacteria vs bad bacteria and want to promote the "good bacteria." The number of U.S. adults taking probiotics has skyrocketed. According to a National Health Interview Survey (NHIS), there has been a 400% growth in adult probiotic use from 2007-2012. This translates to 4 million adults in the United States who use probiotic or prebiotic supplements.

Besides the trillions of microbial cells inside your body, there are colonies of microorganisms on your skin – most of which are beneficial or harmless. However, bacteria such as Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) may also lurk, which is one reason it's especially important to be careful in treating cuts.

Gastroenterologists have had great success in treating diseases such as Clostridium difficile (C. diff) through techniques such as fecal transplant to modify the gut flora. Similar studies have been tested with donor microbiome solutions engrafted to healthy volunteers' skin to better understand various dermatotypes.

One of the things we as dermatologists are focusing on now is how modulating the microbiome can affect

your skin. Research indicates that a healthy mix of bacteria seems to promote the best skin health. There are studies showing dysbiosis, an imbalance of healthy flora, in people's skin with non-treated acne. People who have atopic dermatitis (eczema) also have dysbiosis of their skin microbiome. Additionally, studies

demonstrate that people who have a lower bacterial diversity of their skin are more apt to have worsening of eczema. Research also has shown links between skin dysbiosis and psoriasis and vitiliao.

In the near future, we anticipate we will be able to take a sample of a patient's skin microbiome to examine and provide a more tailored treatment. Currently, there are a few topical skin products which, believe it or not, have prebiotics in them to feed the good bacteria to restore bacteria of the skin's microbiome. Other popular, long-used ingredients like shea butter, niacinamide and thermal spring water have been shown to support greater bacterial diversity.

As these techniques and products progress, we may offer microbiome skin testing as part of our diagnosis and microbiome modulating as part of the treatment. It's a complex and rapidly evolving field in which I am staying abreast and wanted to share an update with you.

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
